This index lists the names of the bride and groom, all four of their parents and the place of the wedding.

## IRELAND

Albert E. Casey. *O'Kief, Coshe Mang, Slieve Lougher and the Upper Blackwater In Ireland* - 3,000,000 names Sixteen volumes indexed alphabetically for the portion of Ireland that is NW Cork and East Kerry - this is a valuable resource for church records, vital records, tombstone inscriptions, newspaper abstracts, civil documents, court records, etc.

## PENNSYLVANIA

*The Colonial Records and The Published Archives of Pennsylvania* consist of 138 volumes on microfiche. This extensive collection began in 1838 and continued until 1935 and contains records from the 17<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup> centuries, especially pre 1830. Historical and genealogical information can be found in other states such as Delaware, New Jersey, Virginia, Maryland, etc. Examples of records: Provincial Council 1683-1775, land warrantees, addresses, proclamations, military rolls from the Revolution to the War of 1812, executive minutes, proceedings of the House of Representative, etc. In order to use the microfiche efficiently, it is imperative that you use the *Guide to the Published Archives of Pennsylvania* by Henry Howard Eddy and Martha L. Simonetti. In addition, there is an index to the Colonial Records series by Dr. Mary Dunn. The microfiche and indexes are in the microfiche cabinets located under the census index tables.

## SOUTH CAROLINA

*The Leonardo Andrea Collection.* Microfilm of manuscript and typescript collection. Contents of folders vary from a few leaves to ca. 300 leaves and may contain genealogical correspondence, transcripts of Bible records, transcripts from public records, clippings from printed materials, pedigree charts, family group sheets, genealogical sketches, etc. Folders may also contain material on related families. Families are chiefly from South Carolina but include some from North Carolina, Virginia and elsewhere, especially in the Southern states. [see Finding Aid ]
